\$3.6 MILLION REASONS TO PLAY PICK-6 WITH XTRA Jackpot Rolls to \$3.6 Million for Nov. 23 Drawing

TRENTON (Nov. 21, 2017) – Although there was no top prize winner for the Monday, Nov. 20 Pick-6 game drawing, there were 16 ticketholders who won \$1,450 for matching five out of the six white balls drawn. Two of those tickets were purchased with the addition of XTRA, multiplying the prize to \$2,900. In addition, thousands of other prizewinning tickets were sold.

The winning numbers for the Monday, Nov. 20 drawing were: 11, 12, 19, 22, 36 and 46. The XTRA Multiplier was: 02. The jackpot for the Pick-6 XTRA game has rolled to \$3.6 million. The next drawing will be held Thursday, Nov. 23.

Executive Director Carole Hedinger announced that there were 464,080 tickets purchased for the drawing. By adding XTRA, for an additional \$1.00 per play, winners are able to multiply their non-jackpot prizes by the XTRA number drawn. For correctly matching four numbers, 441 ticketholders won \$51 each and 54 others won \$102 each with the addition of XTRA. Moreover, for correctly matching three numbers 7,751 ticketholders won \$3.00 each and 1,075 others won \$6 each with the addition of XTRA. Lastly, 7,982 ticketholders each won \$2.00 for correctly matching two numbers with the addition of XTRA on their purchase.
