NJ Lottery Player Discovers \$1,000,000 Ticket Waiting in Wallet

TRENTON (Sept. 11, 2018) – Bruce Schaffer of Marlton was driving to the shore to enjoy a sunny summer day when he saw that the Mega Millions jackpot was over \$500 million for the upcoming Tuesday, July 24 drawing. The staggering jackpot caught his eye and he knew he had to get in the game for his chance to win. So, Bruce stopped by Winslow Citgo on 172 Route 73, Braddock in Camden County, a NJ Lottery retailer, and purchased \$10 worth of Mega Millions on a ticket for the drawing.
