## **PICK-6 JACKPOT REACHES** \$27,200,000

Highest Jackpot for This Game Since 2004

**TRENTON (Nov. 23, 2018)** – Players of the New Jersey Lottery's Pick-6 game have a chance to win \$27.2 million (\$18.7 cash option) in the game's next drawing that will be held Monday, November 26 at 7:57 pm. The game's jackpot has grown to the largest up for grabs since May 2004, so players are urged to get a ticket and get in the game that offers prizes at all levels.

**Nov. 22<sup>nd</sup>'s drawing produced 14 winners of \$2,967** all of whom matched five out of six white balls drawn. **One of those tickets was purchased with XTRA, multiplying the prize to \$8,901**. Acting Executive Director James Carey announced that there were 890,147 tickets purchased for the drawing and of those sold, thousands were prizewinners!

The winning numbers for the Thursday, Nov. 22<sup>nd</sup> drawing were: 13, 25, 27, 34, 36, and 45. The XTRA **Multiplier** was: 03. By adding XTRA for an additional \$1.00 per play, winners are able to multiply their non-jackpot prizes by the XTRA number drawn.

For correctly matching four numbers, 662 ticketholders won \$65 each and 80 others won \$195 each with the addition of XTRA. Moreover, for correctly matching three numbers 13,165 ticketholders won \$3.00 each and 1,727 others won \$9 each with the addition of XTRA. Lastly, 13,085 ticketholders each won \$2.00 for correctly matching two numbers with the addition of XTRA on their purchase.

All New Jersey Lottery game winning numbers and drawings for the Pick-3, Pick-4, Jersey Cash 5, Pick-6, CASH4LIFE and 5 Card Cash games can be viewed on the NJ Lottery website (www.NJLottery.com) or on the official Lottery Facebook Page.
