## Two New Jersey Lottery Players Win \$50,000

Powerball Jackpot Rolls to \$570,000,000

One Maryland Ticket Wins the \$10,000,000 Double Play Jackpot

**TRENTON (Sept. 28, 2021)** – Two New Jersey Lottery tickets matched four of the five white balls and the Powerball drawn for the **Monday, September 27, drawing** winning the **\$50,000** third-tier prize. Those tickets were sold at the following locations:

- Gloucester County: Woodbury Lukoil, 500 North Broad St., Woodbury; and,
- Mercer County: Shoprite #566 of Hamilton Square, 1235 Route 33, Hamilton Square.

The winning numbers for the Monday, September 27, drawing were: 21, 22, 39, 44, and 60. The Red Power Ball number was 12. The Power Play was 2X. 55,779 New Jersey players took home an estimated \$278,717 in prizes ranging from \$4 to \$200. The Powerball jackpot rolls to \$570,000,000 for the Wednesday, September 29, drawing.

## **Double Play Results**

The Double Play drawing is an additional drawing for players who opted-in to the Double Play feature on their tickets. One Maryland Double Play ticket matched all five of the five white balls and the Double Play Power Ball drawn winning the \$10,000,000 Double Play jackpot prize.

The Double Play drawing results for the Monday, September 27, drawing were: **02, 27, 51, 62, and 66**. The red **Double Play Power Ball number** was **01**.
