TRENTON (Jan. 10, 2017) – While there was no winner of the CASH4LIFE jackpot or second prize from the Monday, Jan. 9 drawing, one lucky ticketholder won \$2,500 by matching four out of five white balls and the Cash Ball drawn. Moreover, 23,618 other players won \$98,883 in cash prizes ranging from \$2 to \$500. The winning numbers were: 21, 28, 31, 44 and 51. The Cash Ball was: 01.

This game offers two jackpot prizes for the \$2.00 ticket price. Players select five numbers from a field of one through 60, and then select a "Cash Ball" from a field of one through four. Drawings are held on Monday and Thursday at approximately 9:00 p.m. The next drawing will be held on Thursday, Jan. 12, 2016.
