\$3.4 MILLION REASONS TO PLAY PICK-6 WITH XTRA Jackpot Rolls to \$3.4 Million for Jan. 5 Drawing

TRENTON (Jan. 3, 2017) – Although there was no top prize winner for the Monday, Jan. 2 Pick-6 game drawing, there were 12 ticketholders who won \$1,794 each for matching five out of the six white balls drawn. Two of those tickets were purchased with the addition of XTRA, making them worth \$5,382. In addition, thousands of other prizewinning tickets were sold.

The winning numbers for the Monday, Jan. 2 drawing were: 06, 07, 13, 15, 16 and 32. The XTRA Multiplier was: 03. The jackpot for the Pick-6 XTRA game has rolled to \$3.4 million. The next drawing will be held Thursday, Jan. 5.

Executive Director Carole Hedinger announced that there were 430,764 tickets purchased for the drawing. By adding XTRA, for an additional \$1.00 per play, winners are able to multiply their non-jackpot prizes by the XTRA number drawn. For correctly matching four numbers, 456 ticketholders won \$45 each and 70 others won \$135 each with the addition of XTRA. Moreover, for correctly matching three numbers, 7,971 ticketholders won \$3.00 and 940 others won \$9 each with the addition of XTRA. Lastly, 7,058 ticketholders each won \$2.00 for correctly matching two numbers with the addition of XTRA on their purchase.
