One Jersey Cash 5 Ticket Wins \$150,887 Jackpot in Bergen County

TRENTON (May 31, 2017) — One lucky ticket matched all five numbers drawn winning the \$150,887 Jersey Cash 5 jackpot from the Tuesday, May 30 drawing. The winning numbers were: 07, 16, 21, 41 and 42 and the XTRA number was: 02. The lucky retailer that sold the winning ticket is Quick Mart, 2 Joseph St., Moonachie in Bergen County.

Executive Director Carole Hedinger said, "We are thrilled that the winning jackpot ticket was sold at Quick Mart. The retailer will receive a bonus check for \$2,000 for selling the winning ticket. Overnight, they have become one more 'lucky location' for the very fortunate lottery winner."

Executive Director Carole Hedinger announced that there were 302,207 tickets purchased for the drawing. By adding XTRA, for an additional \$1.00 per play, winners are able to multiply their non-jackpot prizes by the XTRA number drawn. For correctly matching four of the five numbers drawn, 43 ticketholders won \$562 each and 10 others won \$1,124 each with the addition of XTRA. Moreover, for correctly matching three of the five numbers drawn, 1,636 ticketholders won \$17 each and 267 others won \$34 each with the addition of XTRA. Lastly, 3,277 ticketholders each won \$2 for correctly matching two of the five numbers drawn with the addition of XTRA on their purchase.
