New Jersey Sells One \$1,000,000 and Four \$50,000 Tickets as the Powerball Jackpot Rolls to \$403,000,000

TRENTON (Feb. 21, 2017) – There was one New Jersey Lottery ticket sold that matched the 5 white balls drawn to win the \$1,000,000 second-prize for the Saturday, Feb. 18 drawing. If that ticket had been purchased with the Power Play Multiplier option, it would have doubled the prize to \$2,000,000. The winning ticket was purchased in Burlington County at Wrightstown Wine & Liquor, 403 East Main St., Wrightstown.

The winning numbers for the Saturday Feb. 18 drawing were: 03, 07, 09, 31 and 33. The Red Power Ball number was 20. The Multiplier number was 03.

In addition, four New Jersey Lottery tickets were sold that matched the 4 white balls and the Powerball drawn, winning the \$50,000 third prize. If those tickets had been purchased with Power Play, it would have tripled the prize to \$150,000. The tickets were purchased at the following locations:

- Burlington County: Quick Food & Tobacco, 1613 Cinnaminson Ave., Cinnaminson;
- Camden County: ACME Markets #7992, 700 Haddonfield Berlin Rd., Voorhees;
- Morris County: BJ's Wholesale Club #94, 106 Route 23, Riverdale; and
- Ocean County: Wine World, 2085 Route 88, Brick.

In addition to the second and third-tier prizewinning tickets sold, there were 98,582 New Jersey players who took home an estimated \$525,911 in prizes ranging from \$4 to \$300, according to Lottery Executive Director Carole Hedinger.

“Congratulations to all of the lottery players who purchased winning tickets and to the retailers that sold them,” said Hedinger. “The Powerball excitement continues to build as the jackpot climbs to \$403,000,000 for the next drawing to be held Wednesday, Feb 22 at 10:59 pm.”
